Going from Haunting Images of the Past to Positive Images of the Future: Interdisciplinary Perspectives on Emotion, Memory and Mental Imagery

Mental images - the images we 'see' in our mind's eye - have a powerful impact on our emotions, and allow us to time travel, dream and imagine alternative possibilities as 'flash forwards'. Maladaptive forms of mental imagery are common across psychological disorders - from distressing intrusive memories ('flashbacks') after trauma to a lack of positive mental images about the future in depression. This international symposium aims to stimulate interdisciplinary thinking about mental images, its fundamental nature as well as potential for psychological treatment innovation by bringing together experts on mental imagery from a range of different domains.

The symposium is an event of the Natural Sciences Programme (Human Brains & Societies) of the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study (SCAS).
